INTRODUCTION

The San Joaquin Continuum of Care (SJCoC) is soliciting local Letters of Intent for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 Continuum of Care (CoC) Program funding round. This Funding Notice will serve as the Letter of Intent for organizations to apply, and provides preliminary information to the SJCoC for purposes of evaluating project eligibility.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) conducts an annual CoC Program national competition. San Joaquin County (SJC) is the lead agency responsible for completing and submitting the applications on behalf of the CoC. Additional information on the HUD CoC Program can be found here.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS (24 CFR 578.15)

Eligible project applicants include nonprofit organizations, public housing agencies, local governments, and instrumentalities of state and local governments. For-profit entities are not eligible to apply.

LOCAL LETTERS OF INTENT (24 CFR 578.19)

Applicants for renewal and new projects are required to submit a Local Letter of Intent by the deadline. There is a separate Letter of Intent for renewal projects and for new projects.

SJC may request additional materials and/or information at a later date; it is anticipated that any additional materials and information will be requested when HUD publishes the FY2019 CoC Program Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA). Once published, the FY2019 NOFA information and guidance may impact the rating and ranking of projects submitted to HUD in the FY2019 CoC Program competition.

All proposed projects must meet baseline standards of the FY2019 NOFA. In deciding to answer the Letter of Intent, potential applicants should review and fully understand the FY2019 NOFA.

RENEWAL PROJECTS

Currently awarded CoC projects that end in calendar year 2020 are eligible for renewal funding. Applicants for renewal projects must complete the Letter of Intent for Renewal Projects indicating their intent to reapply for funds in FY2019.

NEW PROJECTS

Applicants for new projects must complete the Letter of Intent for New Projects. New projects, if selected for funding, will be required to begin operating on the date proscribed in the 2019 NOFA.

In the event funds are made available for new projects, Letters of Intent for new projects will be considered <u>only</u> from entities that have submitted a Local Letter of Intent by the deadline and are proposing, in alignment with HUD priorities:

- A) Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) dedicated to serving chronically homeless or DedicatedPLUS individuals, including unaccompanied youth, and/or families
- B) Rapid Rehousing (RRH) dedicated to serving homeless individuals, including unaccompanied youth, and/or families coming directly from the streets or emergency shelter, or individuals and/or families who meet the criteria of paragraph (4) of HUD's definition of homeless.

- C) Expansion of an existing eligible renewal project that will increase the number of units, persons served, services provided to existing program participants, or to add additional activities to HMIS and SSO-Coordinated Entry projects.
- D) Permanent Housing/Rapid Re-Housing projects dedicated to serving survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking that are defined as homeless.

MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF FUNDING AVAILABLE

Funding availability for renewal projects is dependent upon the amount made available by the HUD allocation method. Funding for new projects is dependent upon information contained in the HUD FY2019 NOFA, including the opportunity to apply for bonus projects, and any reallocated funds made available through the local project review process. Administrative funds requested for CoC projects will be limited to no more than seven percent (7%) of the total project budget. Administrative funds will be split between the recipient (SJC) and the subrecipient.

MATCH REQUIREMENT (24 CFR 578.73)

The subrecipient must match all grant funds, except for leasing funds, with no less than twenty-five percent (25%) of funds or in-kind contributions from other sources in accordance with 24 CFR § 578.73. Subrecipients will not be required to meet this match per category, but rather as an aggregate sum.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The applicant is required to enter all proposed project information into the electronic application system managed by HUD, called eSnaps. Applicants that submit Letters of Intent must communicate with the lead agency (SJC) to obtain sign-in access to eSnaps. Applicants proposing renewal and/or new projects will be solely responsible for entering information about their proposed projects in a complete manner before the posted deadline for project submissions. Failure to do so will result in projects not being funded.

Applicants seeking funding for <u>new projects</u> must attend an informational session at a date and place to be determined to be considered for funding through the CoC competition. Respondents to the Letter of Intent will be informed of the session's date and location after the deadline for Letter of Intent submission.

DEADLINE: Local Letters of Intent for both renewal and new projects must be received by <u>4:00 PM on</u> <u>Friday, May 17</u>. NO LATE OR INCOMPLETE LETTERS OF INTENT WILL BE CONSIDERED.

LETTER OF INTENT SUBMISSION

<u>Signed</u> Letters of Intent for both renewal and new projects must be submitted on or before the deadline by email, or in person at the County Administrator's Office. Applicants are encouraged to submit their Letters of Intent prior to the deadline.
